The Moravian Graveyards of Lititz, Pa.

The first, or "old," graveyard, a small tract a quarter of an acre or so in extent, is situated within the borough limit a short distance west of the junction of Broad and Centre Streets. On its eastern boundary, two hundred feet back from the king's highway, in the woods, stood the log church which had been built by George Klein (on his land), John Bender, Jacob Scherzer, Hartmann Verdriess, Lutherans, supported by a number of adherents of the Reformed and Mennonite denominations, for the Rev. Lawrence Nyberg, a Swedish Lutheran minister of Lancaster, who subsequently united with the Moravians. Consecrated on St. James' Day, July 25, 1744, it was thenceforth called the St. James' Church. In 1749 the majority of these worshipers, who had been spiritually awakened by the preaching in this vicinity of Count Zinzendorf, in 1742, organized the Warwick (Moravian) Country Congregation, and in 1759 they united with the Lititz congregation. With the completion of the new chapel (second story of the present parsonage,) in 1763, the use of the St. James' Church, except for occasional funeral services, was abandoned; but the graveyard continued to be the burial place of the Warwick members until 1791, when they began to bury in the new graveyard, although some of them were interred in the former plot as late as 1812. Later the remains of some few friendless persons, or vagrants, were buried there.

When, in 1889, the Trustees of that time, actuated by a praiseworthy motive, gave this old graveyard a complete renovation—eradicating a jungle of brambles, repairing the enclosure, and planting trees there—the tombstones, which had been taken up in leveling the ground, were relaid, in exact, straight rows, to be sure, but with such indiscriminate misplacement that their true individual sites are now hopelessly lost; fortunately, the erring stones are covered to a depth of some inches with vegetable mould and grass.

96. **Daniel Lecron.** May 3. Born in the Palatinate, near Heidelberg, in 1712. Came to this country in 1741. Lived first in Lancaster and then moved to Warwick. His second wife was a sister of John Thomas, baker, of Lititz. Deeply impressed by hearing his children pray the religious verses they had learned of Brother Russmeyer, in the Warwick school, he was led to unite with the Brethren, first, in 1759, as an associate, and finally in 1765 as a full member of the Lititz congregation. Funeral service by Brother Grubé. He was of Huguenot origin.

103. **Maria Margaretha Ricksecker,** m.n. Thomas. Born April 4, 1723, in Pfullingen, Würtemberg. The widow of Daniel Lecron, she was married in 1770 to Peter Ricksecker. Died April 10, aged forty-eight years.

106. **Elizabeth Heil.** Daughter of Jacob and Anna Catharine Heil. Aged twenty-two years. December 6.
107. **Anna Catharine Heil,** born Ruehl. Born in Schoharie, N. Y., June 5, 1715 Wife of Jacob Heil. They united with the Brethren in 1749. Had sixteen children. Their farm adjoined the Lititz tract on the east. Died Dec. 23, aged fifty-eight years. Funeral service on Christmas Day by Bishop Hehl.

108. **Christina Margaretha Kiesel,** m.n. Stein. Born on Christmas Day, 1684, in Boeht, near Speier. Married John George Kiesel in 1712, and in 1762 they celebrated their Golden Wedding. Of her seven children she was survived by her sons Nicholas and Frederick. She and her husband were spiritually awakened in 1743 by the preaching of the Brethren, who, before either the St. James' church or the Warwick *Gemeinhaus* were built, frequently held service in their house; and in 1749 they united with the congregation. As a faithful and experienced *wehmutter* she assisted at the birth of three hundred children. Died Dec. 3, aged eighty-nine years.
109. **Christina Westhaeffer,** m.n. Sandritter. Born in the Palatinate, June 21, 1713. In 1732 she came to this country, and in the same year was married to Valentine Westhaeffer. They united with the Brethren at Muddy Creek (Reamstown) in 1746. Moravian ministers, traveling from Bethlehem to Lititz, found their home a pleasant resting-place and Sister Westhaeffer always a generous hostess. She died Dec. 6, aged sixty years.

122. **Jacob Blickensderfer.** He was born in the Palatinate, Feb. 13, 1752. Came with his parents, Christian and Catharina (Sherger) Blickensderfer, in his second year, to this country. Lived here until 1766, when he moved to York where he married Elizabeth Ilgenfritz. A year before his death he returned to this neighborhood. Died Jan. 20, of the then epidemic "camp-fever," aged twenty-six years.
123. **Peter Ricksecker.** Born in the Canton of Berne, Switzerland, Oct. 20, 1710. Came to this country in his thirtieth year. In 1743 he married the widow Anna Jung, in Donegal, Pa., and there they were of the first members of that Moravian congregation. They had three sons, Jacob, Peter, and John. His second wife was the widow Bort, and with her he moved from Donegal to the Bort farm in this neighborhood and united with this congregation. Of his six children by this marriage he was survived by Christian, Gertrude, Anna Johanna, and Elizabeth. His third and fourth wives were the widows Margaretha Lecron and Anna Schneider. For many years he was the Steward of the congregation and Superintendent of the children. Died Feb. 9, aged sixty-seven years.
124. **Christian Palmer.** Born in August, 1703, near Sinsheim, in the Palatinate. Came to this country in 1733, and married the widow Susanna Brunck, with whom he had six children. His second wife, to whom he was married by Pastor Nyberg, was the widow Barbara Pichler; they had seven children. He died March 8, aged seventy-four years.
125. **Michael Grosh.** Infant son of Philip Grosh.

126. **Joseph Gutjahr.** Infant son of Joseph Gutjahr.

127. **Catharine Shoenlein.** Infant daughter of Leonhard Shoenlein.
128. **Anna Apollonia Sherzer,** m.n. Glockenberger. Born Dec. 14, 1711, in the Palatinate. Came to this country with her husband, Jacob Sherzer, in 1738. They were of the first members of the War-

wick congregation. She had five children; Jacob, Philip, and Leonhard surviving her. Died July 16, aged forty-five years.

129. **Barbara Grosh**, m.n. Bort. Born July 20, 1741. Wife of John Grosh. Died Dec. 10, of consumption, aged forty years.
130. **Barbara Margaret Shoenlein**. Infant daughter of Leonhard Shoenlein.
131. **John Bender**. Born in Kirchartd, Baden, September, 1701. Came to this country in 1741. United with the Brethren in 1760. Died April 10, aged eighty-one years. Nine children.
132. **John Frederick Ricksecker**. Infant son of Jacob Ricksecker.

134. **Anna Margaret Bender**. Born Sept. 27, 1711, in the Palatinate. Second wife of John Bender. She had one child, a son, who survived her.
135. **Jacob Heil**. Born in Rohrbach, Palatinate, April 1712. Came to this country in 1730. Married Catharina Ruehl, both uniting with the Warwick Brethren in 1749. Nine of his sixteen children survived him. Died Sept. 5, aged seventy-two years.
136. **Christian Henry Westhaeffer**. Infant son of Conrad Westhaeffer.

137. **Barbara Kiesel**, m.n. Boehler. Born in 1716. Wife of John Nicholas Kiesel. Died Sept. 17, aged sixty-eight years.

1785.

139. **Christoph Frey**. Born May 19, 1721, in Hornbach, Rhenish Bavaria. Came with his parents, Andrew and Susanna Frey, to this country in 1733. Married Margaret Beyer. United with the Warwick Brethren in 1749. Of his eleven children, two sons and four daughters survived him. Died July 30, aged sixty-five years. Funeral service by Bishop Ettwein.
140. **Valentine Westhaeffer**. Born Jan. 1, 1703, in the village of Hohen-Sachsen, between Weinheim and Heidelberg. In 1731 he embarked for America and, after a dreadful voyage of six months duration during which his wife and child and most of the emigrant passengers perished from hunger or thirst, or other maladies, landed in Philadelphia, where, after a few years, he married Christina Sandritter. They had five children; two married sons survived him. He and his wife after being spiritually awakened by the brethren in Oley, united with them at Muddy Creek, in 1746, and were of the first members of that congregation; after its abandonment they belonged to the Warwick congregation. He resided in Lititz 1764-'65, and after his wife's death lived with his sons. Died of dropsy May 12, aged eighty-three years. Funeral service by Brother Dencke.

141. **John Koch.** Born in September, 1705, in Alsace. Converted in Lancaster by the preaching of Zinzendorf. He was one of those members of the Rev. Lawrence Nyberg's congregation who, with their pastor, came over to the Brethren. By trade a wheelwright. He died on his son-in-law John Hoefler's place, five miles from Lititz, July 31, aged eighty-two years.
142. **Nicholas Jungblut.** Born in 1712 in Bechingen, near Landau, Palatinate. His first wife and three children died at sea. In 1743 he married Anna Maria Kappler. Because of a hostile incursion of Indians they were forced to flee hither from their home in Bethel on the Swatara, and here they remained permanently. Ten children. He died Dec. 30, on his place "above the large spring," aged seventy-five years.

143. **Anna Margaretha Frey,** m.n. Bayer. Born in 1727 in Rhenish Bavaria. Wife of Christoph Frey. Died Sept. 4.

146. **Elizabeth Westhaeffer,** m.n. Kling. Born in Chester County, in 1733; a daughter of Christian and Eva Maria Kling. Died Jan. 18. Wife of George Michael Westhaeffer.
147. **John Christian Gutjahr.** Born Oct. 15, 1714, in Wersenburg, Saxony. Married, in Lancaster, 1746, Margaretha Roesner. Nine of his twelve children survived him. Farmer and hatter. Died on his place near Lititz, Feb. 12, aged seventy-six years. One of his descendants was Charles Goodyear, the discoverer of the process for the vulcanization of rubber.
148. **John Nicholas Kiesel.** Born Sept. 24, 1716, in Igelsheim, Palatinate. A son of John George and Christine Margaret (Stein) Kiesel. Married Barbara Boehler. Of twelve children, six survived him. Died Nov. 3, aged seventy-five years.

149. **Anna Maria Jungblut,** m.n. Kappler. Born Oct. 6, 1718, in Kircharadt, Baden. Wife of Nicholas Jungblut. Died July 28, aged seventy-four years.

1793.

150. **Christian Frey.** Born in Hempfield Township, 1748; a son of Christoph Frey. Farmer. Died March 4, aged forty-five years.

1794.

151. **Jacob Sherzer.** Born Aug. 3, 1712, in Michelfelde, Palatinate. Came with his wife Anna Apollonia (Glockenberger) to this country in 1738. Died on his place, near Lititz, Jan. 19, aged eighty-one years.
152. **Anna Maria Huber,** late Eib. Born at sea, Aug. 10, 1727. Her parents were George and Eva (Hammer) Schwab, from the Palat-

inate. They settled in Earl Township. By her first marriage to Michael Eib she had three children; and nine by her second marriage to Peter Huber. Died Jan. 26, aged sixty-six years.

1795.

153. **Philip Koch.** Unmarried. Born in Kussel, Rhenish Bavaria, in 1730. A weaver in the Brethren's House. Died Dec. 6, aged sixty-five years.

154. **Rebecca McClelland.** Infant daughter of Peter McClelland.
 155. **George Huber.** Oldest son of Peter and Rosina (Gutjahr) Huber. Aged seventeen years.
 156. **Peter Huber, Sr.** Born July 15, 1735, in Berlin. Came to this country in 1741. His first wife was Anna Maria Schwab; his second, the Widow Martin (born Sherzer). Died Aug. 1, aged sixty-three years.
 157. **Anna Regina Frey.** Born in 1755; a daughter of Peter Huber, and wife of Christian Frey. Died Aug. 10, aged forty-two years.

 180. **Salome Krall.** Daughter of Abraham Krall. Aged twenty years.
 181. **Jacob Huber.** Died July 4.

THE SECOND GRAVEYARD.

The second, present, graveyard is situated on a gentle acclivity to the south of the church. It was laid out after the invariable manner of Moravian burial places—the tombstones to lie flat on the graves, the sexes in segregation—on the seventh of November, 1758; and we may safely conjecture that the existent venerable cedars bordering the first avenue were planted at about the same time.

The sections to the right (men and boys), and those to the left (women and girls), formed its original extent. Two additional sections increased its size in 1851. Its first enclosure—a low wall of loose stones—was removed in the second decade of the past century, and in its place was then erected a neat fence of pales having a noble entrance gate—its arched top on the side of approach appealing to religious sentiment with these words upon it in finely executed German text:

“Selig sind die Todten die in dem Herrn sterben.”

and on the reverse, “I am the Resurrection and the Life.” Great the pity that this gate was removed, about the year 1850, without any attempt to restore and retain its beautifully appropriate inscriptions.

The first Easter morning service in point of time was held on the St. James' graveyard on April 14, 1759, and concluded on the new graveyard with the Te Deum; and this order was continued until 1763 when the litany was read for the first time on the present graveyard, and repeated in the St. James' Church at 9 o'clock before the sermon. “April 3, 1763: Early at 4 o'clock the congregation was awakened by the French-horns. As we left the chapel, in procession, for the graveyard, the '*waldhornisten*' played '*Allein Gott in der Hök sey Ehr*.' It snowed and rained hard.”—Congregation Diary.

In 1770 trombones were substituted for the French-horns in the church-music.

At the sunrise service of Easter, March 26, 1780, the brightness of the lovely morning was suddenly eclipsed by the passing overhead of countless multitudes of wild pigeons flying, with their wonted swiftness, from North to South.

The first gravediggers for the second graveyard were the Brethren Heil and Baumgaertner.

The total number of those here interred down to April 1, 1905, is 1219.

EXPLANATION OF THE METHOD TO BE USED IN SEEKING THE LOCATION OF A GRAVE.

The avenues are numbered 1, 2, and 3; the rows of graves are given in Roman numerals, counting from the entrance to the graveyard—those to the right of each avenue being indicated by the letter r, and those to the left by the letter l; while the final numeral shows the local number of a grave, thus: Renatus Keller, 1, r. xii, 6, February 22, means that Renatus Keller's grave is on Avenue 1, right side, twelfth row, and its local number is 6; and that he died on February 22. See draft annexed.

1758.

1. **John Baumgaertner.** 1, r. xiv, 1. Nov. 6. A son of Matthew and Barbara Baumgaertner, born in Lititz, Sept. 26. On November 8, the congregation assembled in front of the *Gemeinhaus* where the little corpse was exposed to view; and then, after an address by Bishop Hehl, in which he said that they would begin their new graveyard "*mit diesem ersten Saamen Körngen,*" the funeral procession "of more than eighty people," proceeded to the place of interment. There the usual burial litany was read; then, all kneeling, Bishop Hehl, in fervent prayer, consecrated the spot "for those who in the future should be buried there to rest in hope till that important moment when Christ shall call His own from their graves to a glorious resurrection."

2. **Peter Jacob Jürgensen.** 1, r. xi, 1. Sept. 4. Unmarried.

1760.

3. **Elizabeth Cassler.** 1, l. xiv, 1. April 19. Infant daughter of Lewis Cassler.
4. **Catharine Werner.** 1, l. xiv, 2. Sept. 10. Born April 2, 1759.
5. **Christian Frederick Steinman,** 1, r. xix, 7. Dec. 12. Born in Dresden, Saxony, Nov. 11, 1711. He married Anna Regina Rose, and emigrated with her to America, on the "Irene," in 1749. They arrived in Lititz, from Bethlehem, in 1756, and were to board the men at work on the congregation mill. His widow moved with her son, John Frederick, to Lancaster, where she (Widow Hayne) died, May 30, 1783. There are Moravian descendants of Christian Frederick Steinman living in that city; one of whom is George Steinman, the president of the Lancaster County Historical Society.

1762.

6. **Gottlieb Bezold.** 1, r. x, 1. Apr. 1. Unmarried. Born Nov. 1, 1720, at Bischofswerda, Saxony, where he lived as a young man, his trade that of pursemaker. Came to America, 1742, with the first "Sea Congregation." Ordained a Deacon in 1748. He was the Elder-General of all the unmarried men, ("Single Brethren") belonging to the American Moravian Church. Died while on a visit to Lititz, whither he had come to install Bro. Lorenz Bagge as the *Pfleger* (Spiritual Overseer) of the Single Brethren. Was the architect of the Lititz Brethren's House.
7. **Anna Rebecca Merck.** 1, l. xiv, 3. Aug. 24. Infant daughter of Henry and Rebecca Merck.

1764.

8. **Martin Bort.** 1, r. xi, 2. Oct. 23. Unmarried. Born in Warwick Township, Aug. 14, 1743. Learned shoemaking with Bro. Lewis Cassler.

1765.

9. **Abraham Haller.** 1, r. xi, 3. Oct. 11. Unmarried. Only son of John Henry and Anna Maria Haller. Born at Muddy Creek (Reams-town) Jan. 9, 1744.
10. **Anna Johanna Thomas.** 1, l. xiv, 4. Dec. 10. Infant of John and Maria Salome Thomas.

1767.

11. **John Christian Fenstermacher.** 1, r. xix, 6. Dec. 8. Born April 14, 1697, in Meissenheim, Rhenish Bavaria. After his apprenticeship he was for six years Court Butcher to the Count von Daun, on the Rhine, and then served one year in the Dutch war. In 1741 he came to Pennsylvania with his family. His wife died at sea, leaving him with three children, one of whom was the mother of Wm. Werner of Lititz. Arrived in Philadelphia, mentally, physically and financially depressed, he was soon comforted by Count Zinzendorf and others of the Brethren, whom he joined in 1748. May, 1749, he married the widow Barbara Leibert. Came to Lititz Sept. 1, 1764, to take charge of the congregation store, on his own account for a few years, when it was to be returned to the church. After a short illness of three days duration, he died, "a happy child of grace," aged seventy years.

1768.

12. **Anna Regina Niecke.** 1, l. xi, 1. March 10. Unmarried. Born in Reingenheim, near Manheim, April 22, 1737. In faithful service, seven years, with Fenstermacher's, and later at Bro. Jasper Payne's.

1769.

13. **Christina Baumgaertner.** 1, l. xiv, 5. March 23. Born Feb. 16, 1760. Daughter of Matthew Baumgaertner.
14. **Christina Cassler.** 1, l. xiv, 6. April 18. Third daughter of Lewis and Christina Cassler, born 1765. Died of small-pox.

15. **Anna Elizabeth Cassler.** 1, 1, xiv, 7. April 27. Same parents. Born July 6, 1767. Died of small-pox.
16. **Anna Maria Werner,** m.n. Schuchard. 1, 1, xix, 1. May 13. Born in Heidelberg Township, June 26, 1727. Married William Werner. They had five children; Catharina, and, surviving her, Rosina, Frederick, Nathaniel and John.

1770.

17. **Christian Henry Sproge.** 1, 1, xi, 4. May 16. Unmarried. Born April 23, 1729, in Curland near Bauske. By trade a mason. Came to Lititz, 1758, one of the original six brethren to occupy the new Brethren's House. Highly esteemed as superintendent of the larger boys. Some of his last work was the building of the first corpse depository (*Leichen Capellchen*), a vault in the basement of the *Gemeinhaus* (now the parsonage), and his own mortal remains were the first to lie there. (The entrance to this vault was on the west side of the house, under an outside stairway used by the brethren in going to the *Saal*, or meeting-place of the congregation, on the second floor. The present corpse-house was built, with the church, in 1787.)

1771.

18. **John Valentine Grosh.** 1, 1, xix, 5. April 17. Born Jan. 6, 1706, at Eichloch in the Palatinate. In 1728 he married Barbara Sandman. They had twelve children. In 1743 they came to Pennsylvania with five children remaining to them, and settled near Lititz. In 1749 he joined the Warwick (Moravian) Congregation, was its first chief-sacristan, and for many years its Steward. In 1764 he moved to Lititz, where he was appointed Curator of the Sisters' "Choir," and, again, chief sacristan. On April 15, of the above year, he was stricken with paralysis, remaining unconscious until his death. There are descendants of his living in Lititz.
19. **Carl August Ludewig.** 1, 1, xi, 5. July 2. Unmarried. Born March 9, 1729, in Wernerode, Thuringia. A potter.
20. **Gottlieb Coelln.** 1, 1, xiv, 2. July 7. Infant son of Claus and Elizabeth Coelln, and twin brother of John Coelln.
21. **Maria Barbara Geitner.** 1, 1, xiii, 1. Aug. 22. Born June 13, 1764. Daughter of John George Geitner.
22. **Christian Gottlieb Hoffman.** 1, 1, x, 2. Aug. 25. Unmarried. Born in Friedersdorf, Upper Lusatia, Dec. 21, 1715. For seven years, from 1765, he was the universally beloved *Pfleger* of the Single Brethren.
23. **Elizabeth Hall,** m.n. Kalkloeser. 1, 1, xix, 2. Oct. 3. Born in Germantown, Feb. 1, 1738. Married James Hall, Oct. 23, 1770. Died of complications arising from the birth of a son.
24. **Thomas Utley.** 1, 1, xi, 6. Nov. 11. An unmarried son of the Rev. Richard Utley, born in Bethlehem, June 27, 1751. Shoemaker. A consumptive, he came here in August, 1770, at the suggestion of Bro. Tobias Beckel, who was much attached to him, to have medical

treatment from a certain Dr. Blank—"the old Swiss doctor"—who at that time practised in this neighborhood. In connection with the burial of this Brother, the Brethren's House Diary gives us the following singular circumstance: When the gravedigger had partly filled in the grave he heard three distinct knocks which seemed to him to come from the inside of the coffin-lid. He quickly called a number of the brethren to the spot, and they decided to re-open the coffin, for if they failed to do so, an unfounded "talk" would be the result: therefore, it was taken up and opened; but Brother Thomas lay just as he had been deposited there, and not a sign of vitality was apparent. The brethren inferred that the knockings, which were heard again as they re-filled the grave, arose from the pressure of ground on the coffin-lid.

25. **Elizabeth Brinkman.** 1, l. xi, 2. March 8. Unmarried Sister. Born in York, Jan. 8, 1751.
26. **Abraham Delker.** 1, r. xi, 7. March 13. Unmarried. Born in Dornhan, Württemberg, Aug. 26, 1746.
27. **Anna Hanke.** 1, l. xi, 3. May 19. Unmarried Sister. Born in Gnaden-thal, near Nazareth, Feb. 6, 1748.
28. **Samuel Scheffel.** 1, r. xiv, 3. Nov. 21. Son of Ernst and Catharine Scheffel, born in Lititz, Nov. 9, 1770. Aged two years.

1774.

29. **Catharine Elizabeth Scheffel.** 1, l. xiii, 2. Feb. 20. Infant daughter of the foregoing parents.
30. **Christian Tshudy.** 1, r. xix, 4. March 3. Born in Warwick Township, April 20, 1741. His parents were Henry and Catharine Tshudy, members of the Warwick Moravian congregation. Married, 1762, Eva Barbara Kiesel. Moved to Lititz, 1762, hearty permission having been accorded him as "a worthy acquisition" to the community. Built a house on Main St., about midway of the present Seminary grounds, and followed his work as a day-laborer. He had four children: John Jacob, Christian, Anna Maria (married Rev. John Maehr) and Matthias. Christian Tshudy, Jr., moved to Ohio, where his descendants are living.
31. **Maria Christina Schmidt.** 1, l. xi, 4. April 19. The remarkable experience of this unmarried Sister deserves the larger space devoted to it. She was born in Conewago, near York, Pa., Aug. 1, 1746. At an early age the preaching of Moravian itinerants made an impression upon her heart, and she beseeched the Lord to make her His happy child and grant her wish to join, eventually, the sweet Sisterhood in Bethlehem. When the congregation at Manocasy (Graceham) Md., was founded, her father, Caspar Schmidt, and his family moved thither so that they might be with the Brethren. During the French and Indian War, when Christina was nine years old, in August, 1755, the dwellers in that locality were thrown into consternation by the swift irruption of a band of ravaging, murderous Indians (French). The Schmidts and others sought refuge

in the Moravian school-house, but Christina and her father were eight miles away from it on his plantation. Suddenly, from the forest, they heard the sharp crack of a rifle! The father threw his child upon a horse, telling her to ride as fast as she could to the shelter of the school-house, but the horse balked and refused to move, while several Indians appeared, rapidly crossing the clearing. Schmidt's first impulse was to remain with his daughter, but to do that he knew was to be killed on the spot, and others needed his protection; so he fled precipitately, fortunately escaping some bullets sent after him. Capturing Christina, an Indian swung her on to his back and made away with her, she vigorously protesting and making frantic appeal to be set free; to all of which he only answered "Yes, yes," and strode away the faster. In a desperation almost as comical as it was futile, she drew from her clothing *a pin* and with all her little force jabbed it into his broad back, which caused him to put her to the ground and despoil her of her pins. After that, a threatening tomahawk always kept her quiet. Now the whole band turned upon its homeward route, traveling northward. On this journey Christina's tender eyes beheld the most frightful massacres; and when, upon coming to one of their settlements destroyed by the English, the avenging Indians took some of her fellow-captives, bound them to trees, and, thrusting into their bodies pointed sticks of resinous wood, set fire to them—a continuant torture from morning to night—the savage fiends compelled her *to laugh with them* at the agony of their victims. Approaching their town—its score of dogs giving timely notice of their coming—they were met and welcomed with wild shouting and much rude drumming, by the young braves and the women and children. Among the Indians, for several years, she was not treated unkindly. Once she was rescued from the death-hug of a bear, and at another time she had nearly drowned; "But," says she, "surely the Saviour remembered that I should so much like to live and die with the Brethren." In 1757, to her infinite joy, she was taken by three chiefs to Philadelphia, where, as a result of a treaty of peace, she was set at liberty, finding a home in a kind Quaker family. During her stay with them a man who had "dreamed" that she was his kidnapped child came to the city, claimed her, and, following the decision of a magistrate, took her, despite her denial of him, with him to Lancaster. "My continual prayer," she writes, "was that the good Lord would restore me to my true parents; and He heard me, too." To the Synod of 1758, convened in Lancaster, came her father and mother; they heard of the child, went to see her, there was mutual recognition, a dispute with the pretended father, and, finally, recourse to a Justice of the Peace who said to the Schmidts, "Take her, for flesh and blood will not be denied!" Then the happy parents with their child repaired to the "school-house" (in West Orange St.) where they were presented to the assembled synod and congregation by Brother Joseph (Spangenberg) who, taking Christina by the hand, asked her father and mother, "Will you give this child to the Saviour and the

Brethren?" So, after a visit to her Maryland home, she joined the Sisters' "Choir" in Bethlehem. In 1770, because of ill-health, consumption, she was transferred to the Sisters' House in Lititz, so that she might have the medical attention of Dr. Fahnestock of Ephrata; then came a temporary restoration, a recurrence, and death in her twenty-eighth year.

32. **Sarah Delker.** 1, 1. xi, 5. Nov. 24. Unmarried Sister. Born in Dornhan, Wuerttemberg, Sept. 7, 1748.

1775.

33. **John Andrew Blickensderfer.** 1, r. x, 3. Jan. 10. Unmarried. Oldest son of Christian and Catharina Blickensderfer. Born April 18, 1750, in the village of Lower Sauchheim in the Palatinate.
34. **Eva Barbara Tshudy, m.n. Kiesel.** 1, 1. xix, 3. March 7. Wife of Christian Tshudy. Born at Muddy Creek, Nov. 23, 1746. Died of diphtheria, then epidemic.
35. **John Ernst Scheffel.** 1, r. xiv, 4. March 28. Young son of Ernst and Catharine Scheffel, born Jan. 28, 1765. Died of diphtheria.
36. **Peter Williard.** 1, r. x, 4. April 17. Unmarried. Born in Manocasy, Md., Feb. 4, 1751. Tanner's apprentice with Brother Geitner.
37. **Anna Barbara Yungblut.** 1, 1. xi, 6. April 19. Unmarried Sister. Born in Bethel on the Swatara, May 16, 1751.

1776.

38. **Gottfried Roesler.** 1, r. xix, 3. Jan. 6. Born April 11, 1711, in Neustadt near Dresden, Saxony. Came to Pennsylvania in 1750. Ordained a Deacon of the Church in 1759, at the Synod in Lancaster. Served at Donegal, Hebron, Warwick and in other country congregations. His last seven years were spent in Lititz as schoolmaster for the Warwick boys. Married Marianne Mueller. They had two children, twins, who died soon after birth. On the morning of Jan. 6, as he was returning from a country visit, he was stricken with sudden death and fell, as he was found, by the roadside, his face imbedded in the snow. His funeral was largely attended, for, "because of his fine school" he was respected and loved by old and young.
39. **Christian Thomas.** 1, r. x, 5. Feb. 4. Unmarried. Born in Lancaster, Nov. 1, 1754, and came with his parents John and Maria Salome (m.n. Gorner) Thomas to Lititz in 1759. Exceptionally talented in music, he was the first organist of the Lititz congregation. Died of miliary fever.
40. **Hans Christopher Christensen.** 1, r. x, 6. Sept. 15. Unmarried. Born Feb. 7, 1716, near Hadersleben, Holstein. Joined the Moravians, in Herrnhut, 1745. Came to Bethlehem, 1751. An expert mill-wright and hydraulic engineer, he built the first oil-mill and the water-works in Bethlehem; a grist and saw-mill in Bethabara, N. C.; the same for Hope, N. J., and, besides many more, the first grist and saw-mill in Lititz, in 1757. Upon hearing of the total destruction by fire, in 1775, of the latter, he volunteered his services, although in an

advanced stage of consumption, to build a new one (which is still standing); and this he accomplished, but at such expense of his waning strength that he was constrained to take a bed in the infirmary of the Brethren's House, and there he died.

41. **Margaretha Elizabeth Grubé**, m.n. Krieger. 1, 1. xx, 2. Nov. 10. Born Nov. 12, 1716, at Reval, Livonia. In 1754 she was married to Joachim Busse, going with him to Herrnhut and uniting with the Moravians. Together they went, 1751, as missionaries to St. Thomas, where her husband died, leaving her with eight children, of whom Andrew Busse (once pastor in Nazareth) was the eldest. In the same year she came to Bethlehem, and in 1755 was married to Bernhard Adam Grubé, with whom she served in the Indian missions of Gnadenhuetten, Pachgatgoch and Wechquetank, and accompanied the Moravian Indians into exile, for safety, to Province Island, and, subsequently, to the "Barracks" in Philadelphia. During these missionary years she suffered hardships innumerable. In Pachgatgoch, for instance, the winter night was so bitterly cold in their wigwam, that to save her baby's life she must make its sleeping place between two great Indian dogs. In May, 1765, they were called to Lititz, her husband to be co-pastor with Bishop Hehl and have the superintendence of the congregation schools; also to organize a choir and church orchestra. For eleven years she served as Spiritual Overseer of the married Sisters. They had one daughter, Anna Johanna, who married the Rev. John Martin Beck. Her final illness was caused by exposure to extremely inclement weather as she came, in an open conveyance, from a visit in Bethlehem to Lititz. Her husband wrote of her "She was a woman of much experience."
42. **Susanna Michler**. 1, 1. xx, 3. Dec. 9. Born March 15, 1722, in Wildberg, Württemberg. United with the Brethren at Marienborn, 1743. There she was married to John George Ohneberg, coming, same year, with him to Bethlehem. In 1744 they moved to Nazareth, where, in the economy of that time, they superintended the clearing of the land and establishing of the farms. In 1748 they had charge of the school in Macungie (Emmaus) and later that of Lancaster. Received a call, 1750, as missionaries to St. Thomas, W. I., and then to St. Croix. Returned to Bethlehem, 1760, where her husband died. They had fifteen children. In 1762 she married Rev. John Michler, served with him in the school in Nazareth Hall, and then they were called, she for the second time, to the West India mission, Jamaica. Returned, 1770, and served in Heidelberg, Pa. In 1776 they sought retirement in Lititz, and here she died.

1777.

43. **Peter Mordick**. 1, 1. x, 7. Jan. 19. Unmarried. Born in Nazareth Sept. 7, 1755. Nailsmith. Died, a patient sufferer, of an epidemic pectoral fever.
44. **Elias Glotz**. 1, 1. xix, 2. Feb. 18. Born Dec. 7, 1745; oldest son of Albrecht and Margaretha (m.n. Rieth, of Tulpehockon) Glotz. Em-

- ployed on the farm of John Henry Haller, whose daughter Elizabeth he married. No children.
45. **Anna Maria Shank.** 1, 1. xi, 7. Feb. 26. Unmarried Sister. Born Jan. 24, 1749, in Upper Kiepingen, Württemberg. Came, in her fourth year, with her parents, to this country. In her fifteenth year she was "awakened" by the personal persuasion of David Zeisberger, giving him "her hand to it" to remain true to the Saviour. Came to Lititz, 1768, engaged in domestic service in Jasper Payne's family, and in 1770 moved into the Sisters' House, where she died of consumption.
46. **Elizabeth Beck.** 1, 1. x, 7. Sept. 4. Unmarried Sister. A daughter of the Rev. Henry Beck, she was born in Bethlehem, Oct. 11, 1746. Came in 1763 to the Lititz Sisters' House. Superintendent of the weaving department. Died of consumption.
47. **Anna Maria Hehl.** 1, 1. xx, 1. Nov. 22. Beloved wife of Bishop Matthew Hehl. Born in Berthelsdorf, Upper Lusatia, Nov. 17, 1716. Her parents were Christopher and Helena (m. n. Henk) Jaehne, descendants of Moravian exiles. Spiritually awakened in the children's revival of 1727, in Herrnhut. In 1733, in her seventeenth year, previously confirmed in Herrnhut, she partook for the first time of the Lord's Supper, and was blessed by Pastor Rothe, in the church of Berthelsdorf. In 1737, Nov. 17, she was married to Matthew Hehl who, while she had charge of the girls in the Herrnhut Orphanage, served in the same situation for the boys. Three children were born to them: John and Johanna Maria, both dying in infancy, and Mathew Leonhard, born in Herrnhut, in 1749. In August, 1751, they received their call to Pennsylvania. Leaving their little son at school in Barby—he rejoined them after nineteen years—they sailed from London, arriving in Bethlehem, Dec. 10. In November, 1756, they came to Lititz, Bro. Hehl a newly-consecrated bishop of the Brethren's Church. She died of a pectoral fever on the fortieth anniversary of their marriage.
48. **Catharina Volck.** 1, 1. x, 6. Dec. 12. Unmarried Sister. Born April 2, 1743, in Lynn, Pa.

1778.

49. **John Jacob Schmick.** 1, 1. xx, 2. Jan. 23. Presbyterian. Born Oct. 19, 1714, at Koenigsberg, Prussia. While in charge of a Lutheran congregation in Livonia, he became acquainted with the Moravians and united with them in 1748. Came to Bethlehem in 1751, destined for service in the Indian mission. 1752, ordained a Deacon of the Church. Ordained a presbyter in 1759. Married Johanna Ingerheidt. With his wife he labored in various missions. A proficient in the Mohican language, and adopted by the Shawanese into their nation. Was with the Christian Indians in exile, for safety, in Philadelphia, and, after their release, led them to Wyalusing. His last mission was at Gnadenhuetten, Ohio. In August, 1777, he came to Lititz, and was appointed an assistant to Bishop Hehl, while his wife became the Spiritual Overseer of the Married Sisters.

- When, in December, the U. S. military hospital was established in the Brethren's House, he preached faithfully to the wretched soldiery; and there he contracted the "camp-fever" of which he died. One son, John Jacob, survived him; two daughters preceded him into eternity.
50. **Catharina Blickensderfer**, m.n. Sherzer. 1, l. xix, 4. Jan. 27. Born Oct. 14, 1727, in Eisenbach, Rhenish Bavaria. Married Christian Blickensderfer, and came with him and two children, first to Philadelphia, where they lived one and a half years, and then to a farm near Lititz. In 1761 they built a house in the village and moved into it. Of her nine children two sons and a daughter survived her. Died of the epidemic "camp-fever."
51. **Henry Oerter**. 1, r. xii, 2. Jan. 31. Born in Bethlehem, April 10, 1752; second son of Christian Frederick Oerter, and twin-brother of Anna Oerter. Unmarried. Came to Lititz, 1775, to take charge of the Brethren's smithy. Died of the epidemic "camp-fever."
52. **Christopher Pohl**. 1, r. xii, 1. Feb. 1. Unmarried. Born Jan. 6, 1724, in Habendorf, Lower Silesia. Came to Lititz, 1759, and here he was for nineteen years cook in the Brethren's House. Died of the epidemic "camp-fever."
53. **Elizabeth Michler**. 1, l. x, 5. March 13. Unmarried Sister. Born on the Island of St. Thomas, where her parents were missionaries, April 4, 1756.
54. **Elizabeth Ricksecker**, m.n. Krieger. 1, l. xix, 5. Sept. 3. Wife of Peter Ricksecker. Born Dec. 2, 1751, in Manocasy, Md. Had two children, a son and a daughter. Died four hours after the birth of the latter.

56. **Matthew Baumgaertner**. 1, r. xx, 3. April 19. Born in Switzerland, Oct. 6, 1708. Settled in Donegal, but, in 1758, having fled for safety from the Indians to Lititz, he received permission to remain here. By his first wife he had one daughter, Catharina; by the second (m.n. Goepfert) he had twelve children, six surviving him.
57. **Maria Elizabeth Ricksecker**. 1, l. xiii, 3. June 5. Infant daughter of Peter Ricksecker (at the fulling-mill). Aged 9 months.
58. **Jasper Payne**. 1, r. xx, 4. July 3. Born April 23, 1708, in Twickenham, England. Came in 1743 with his wife and aged mother to Bethlehem, where he was made steward of the Economy. Ordained a Deacon of the Church, 1753. Served several years in Philadelphia, but for the most part, labored in the Gospel in the rural churches. In 1767 he came to Lititz to take charge of the congregation store. By his second wife (m.n. Philippina Way, of New London, Conn.) he had two sons, Jasper and Nathaniel, both surviving him.
59. **Johanna Rosina Rauch**. 1, l. xiii, 4. Jan. 11. Infant of John Henry and Catharine Rauch.

60. **Catherine Toon**. 1, l. x, 4. Jan. 11. Unmarried Sister. Born March 9, 1761. A poor, homeless and consumptive girl of eighteen years,

she endeavored, in June, 1799, to make her way, as best she might, from Carroll's Manor, Maryland, to Lititz, where she hoped to be received into the Sisters' House, her half-sister Mary Tippet, being one of that "choir." Arrived at an inn in Taneytown, with seventy more miles to go, the landlord kindly allowed her to remain there for a short time in the hope that some passing conveyance might take her farther on her way. "After a few days, Col. Curtis Grubb came in his coach to the inn. I begged him to take me with him to the neighborhood of Lancaster, but he refused me point-blank, saying that he could not drag a sick woman about with him. Then, upon my further entreaty, he asked me, 'Well, where, near Lancaster, do you wish to go?' To Lititz, to my sister, said I. 'Have you a sister in Lititz—and does she belong to the Brethren? Well, then I will take you with me.' During the whole journey he treated me with the tenderness of a father; would not allow me to pay for anything, and ordered for me such delicacies as were best adapted to my enfeebled condition. He repeatedly assured me, in words of kind encouragement, how happy I should be if I obtained leave to live with the Brethren and Sisters at Lititz, for he knew them to be true children of God. When we were come four miles from Lititz where his homeward way led off from the Lititz road, (at Neffsville, via Manheim for Mt. Hope) he gave me a letter he had written to Bro. Andrew Horn (landlord of *Zum Anker* Inn near Lititz) to insure my good reception with him; placed me in the care of his secretary for the remaining distance, and then, at parting with me, pressed into my hand a beautiful piece of gold. Oh, God, reward him for his kindness!"

61. **John Renatus Christ.** I, r. xiv, 5. Jan. 21. Infant son of Peter and Juliana Christ.
62. **Anna Magdalena Meyer.** I, l. x, 3. April 6. Unmarried Sister. Born in Ulm, May 1, 1710. Came to Lititz, 1762, to be the first *Pflegerin* (Spiritual Overseer) in the new Sisters' House; but in 1764 she was superseded in this office by Sr. Augustine and given that of Warden of her "choir," a position which she filled admirably for sixteen years to her end.
63. **Maria Kreiter,** m.n. Hirschy. I, l. xix, 6. Aug. 31. Born in Hempfield Township, 1728. Wife of Peter Kreiter. They moved to Lititz in 1770. Eight children, all of whom survived her.
64. **Anna Dorothea Glotz.** I, l. x, 2. Sept. 19. Unmarried Sister. Consumption.

65. **John George Ohneberg.** I, r. xii, 4. April 24. Unmarried. Born on the Island of St. Croix, Dec. 19, 1751.
66. **Rosina Christ.** I, l. xiii, 5. May 24. Daughter of Peter Christ, aged four years and nine months. Her death was caused by the lodgment of a bean in her windpipe.
67. **Christian Henry Werner.** I, r. xiv, 6. May 26. Born in Lititz, 1775.

68. **Anna Christina Francke**, m.n. Bezold. 1, l. xx, 4. June 14. Wife of Rev. John Chistopher Francke. Born Oct. 28, 1713, in Halle, Saxony. Came to Lititz, 1763. Of three sons and four daughters only John Immanuel and Agnes survived her.
69. **Anna Maria Cassler**. 1, l. x, 1. Sept. 17. Unmarried Sister. Born in Lititz, April 1, 1761. Daughter of Lewis and Christina Cassler.
70. **Adolph Meyer**. 1, r. xx, 5. Oct. 6. Physician and surgeon to the Lititz congregation. Born in Westerhausen, Saxony, March 15, 1714. Learned his profession from his father. United with the Brethren in Herrnhut, 1736. In 1739 he married Mary Dorothea Cartaus, and received a call to Pennsylvania. His wife, because of sickness, could not accompany him; later she sailed for America but died off the Banks of Newfoundland and was buried at sea. Arrived in Philadelphia, Dr. Meyer was sent to Nazareth where he practiced medicine and was the first Elder of the congregation. In 1745 he married Maria Justina Kraft, and in 1746 they were called to take charge of the Boys' School in Fredericktown, remaining in that situation until the close of 1749. Because of Sr. Meyer's continual ill-health, they asked for their release and began housekeeping for themselves, Dr. Meyer serving his neighborhood with his medical and surgical knowledge. "Our attachment to the Congregation was never lessened, and although we did not visit it, we, as was the case with the Prophet Daniel, never lost our remembrance of or our longing for it." At that time his son Christian—a bright young man—died. "Visited by the Brethren, their kind love melted my heart, and made us long to live again in a *Gemein-ort*" (Congregation settlement). Therefore they were appointed to Lititz, and came hither June 6, 1776.
71. **Samuel Krause**. 1, r. xii, 5. Oct. 22. Unmarried. Born in Nazareth, Nov. 22, 1749. Master of domestic affairs in the Brethren's House. Died of an epidemic fever.

72. **Maria Van Vleck**, m.n. Schmidt. 1, l. xix, 7. Jan. 27. Born in Bethlehem, April 24, 1752. First wife of Henry Van Vleck (hatter).
73. **John Renatus Keller**. 1, r. xii, 6. Feb. 22. Unmarried. Born Aug. 23, 1727. In 1773 he was ordained a Deacon of the church and then received a call to Pennsylvania, coming the same year to Lititz. Warden of the Single Brethren's "choir." Died of consumption.
74. **Elizabeth Ricksecker**. 1, l. xii, 7. May 7. Unmarried Sister. Born in Warwick, 1762. Daughter of Peter Ricksecker.
75. **John Christopher Francke**. 1, r. xii, 7. Aug. 22. Born in Schneeberg, Saxony, Dec. 30, 1711. Converted by the preaching of Zinzendorf in Berlin. Married Anna Christina Bezold. Came to this country, 1742. Director of the Boys' Schools in Nazareth, Fredericktown, Oley and Macungie. Ordained a Deacon of the Church, 1749. In Lititz, from 1763, he and his wife had the superintendence of the married "choir" and he was the congregation's Warden. He was stricken with apoplexy while sitting, as president, at a meeting of

the *Aufscher Collegium* (Committee of Temporal Affairs), dying soon afterwards.

76. **Sophia Dorothea Gattermeyer.** 1, l. xii, 6. Aug. 29. Unmarried Sister. Born in Bethlehem, Jan. 19, 1751. Her father, John Gattermeyer, was killed by the Indians in the massacre at Gnadenhuetten on the Mahony, 1755. Consumption.
77. **Margaretha Kling.** 1, l. xii, 5. Nov. 13. Unmarried Sister. Born in Donegal, Pa., 1737. Employed in the bakery of the Sisters' House and was mistress of its dairy.
78. **John Gottfried Zahm.** 1, r. xii, 7. Dec. 19. Unmarried. Born in Bethlehem, May 10, 1753. Came in 1779 to Lititz as *Pfleger* (Spiritual Overseer) of the Single Brethren. Both he and his second in authority, (Renatus Keller, Warden, No. 73) were remarkably successful in their calling with the young men. They lie side by side on the graveyard. A fine musician. Ordained a Deacon of the Church a few months before his death. Consumption.

79. **Catharine Rauch,** m.n. Gutjahr. 1, l. xviii, 1. Jan. 2. Born in Lancaster, Feb. 3, 1747. First wife of John Henry Rauch. Consumption.
80. **Martha, an Indian.** 1, l. xii, 4. March 20. Unmarried Sister. Born in Shecomeko, 1739. Her parents were Thomas and Esther, Mohicans. Baptized by Christian Henry Rauch. 1748, was servitress in the Germantown Moravian School; 1763-64, in exile with the Christian Indians in Philadelphia. Came in 1771 to Lititz to be the mistress-tailoress in the Sisters' House. Served, also, several years as a teacher in the congregation day-school for girls.
81. **Dorothea Klein,** m.n. Davis. 1, l. xviii, 2. July 23. Born Aug. 28, 1721, "on the Schuylkill." Was converted by Zinzendorf when he, with other Brethren, lodged in her brother-in-law's barn. Her third husband was George Klein, popularly known as the founder of Lititz. Lived in Bethlehem, but came to Lititz to have the treatment of Dr. Fahnestock, of Ephrata, for a cancerous affection about her head. Somewhat improved she returned to her home, but, her malady increasing again, she came back to Lititz to have her physician's care until her death, which she knew to be inevitable. About the time of her funeral an express came to Lititz with the news of her husband's death in Bethlehem. (George Klein and his first wife, Anna, m.n. Bender, both came from Kirchardt in the Palatinate. In 1754 he donated 491 acres of land to the Lititz Congregation, receiving from the church an annuity of £70 during his life).
82. **John Paul Hennig.** 1, r. xii, 8. Aug. 21. Unmarried. Born Jan. 1, 1715, of Roman Catholic parents. United with the Moravians in Herrnhag, 1743. Came to this country in 1750, and was employed in the Economy at Christianspring as cook, and also as a teacher of the boys. To Lititz in 1767 as master-shoemaker in the Brethrens' House.

83. **Dorothea Rosina Horn**, m.n. Fischer. 1, 1. xviii, 3. Oct. 18. Born in Lower Silesia, Sept. 3, 1713. Wife of Bro. Andrew Horn.
84. **Elizabeth Peter**, m.n. Koehler. 1, 1. xviii, 4. Dec. 18. Born in Macungie (Emmaus) Sept. 11, 1749. Wife of Bro. Simon Peter. Consumption.

1784.

85. **Frederick Peter**. 1, r. xiv, 7. March 11. Infant son of Simon and Elizabeth Peter.
86. **John Nathaniel Danz**. 1, r. xiv, 8. July 31. Infant son of Simon Danz.
87. **Marie Magdalena Augustine**. 1, 1. xii, 3. May 23. Unmarried Sister. Born in Gotha, Thuringia, Aug. 3, 1714. After much varied service in European congregations she, in 1763, sailed with Capt. Jacobson in the "Hope" from Gravesend for New York, having a calm and delightful voyage; and thence came directly to Lititz whither she had been called, and where she continued until her death the very distinguished *Pflegerin* of the Sisters' "choir." She was also the General Superintendent of the Single Sisters in America.
88. **Henry Frey**. 1, r. xx, 6. Sept. 25. Born May 12, 1724, in Falckner's Swamp. Converted by the preaching of Christian Henry Rauch, he united with the Moravians in 1744. Destined for the Indian mission he learned the Maqua language from Bro. Pyrlaeus. Accompanied David Zeisberger on his journey to Onondaga. Married Anna Maria Buerstler. Served the Church in various capacities; was the Warden of Nazareth Congregation; and finally came to Lititz where, for a few years, he was the miller, and then moved up into the village to work at his trade of carpentry. When the mill was destroyed by fire in 1775, he as master-carpenter superintended the building of the new (present) one.
89. **Anna Maria Frey**. 1, 1. xviii, 5. Sept. 27. Born in Oley, Feb. 23, 1730. Wife of Henry Frey.
90. **Anna Maria Protzman**. 1, 1. xviii, 6. Nov. 3. Born Sept. 23, 1723, in Waechtersbach, near Herrnhag. Wife of John Ludwig Protzmann, who died in 1778. Epidemic fever. She had five sons and three daughters. Nine grandchildren.
91. **Beata Rauch**. 1, 1. xiii, 6. Nov. 12. Infant daughter of John Henry Rauch.

92. **John Michler**. 1, r. xx, 7. June 20. Born Oct. 24, 1720, in Leuchingen, Wuerttemberg. Served in the boys' schools of Nazareth and Fredericktown and twice as a missionary in the West Indies. His second wife was Margaret Roseen, m.n. Rieth; his third the Widow Ohneberg; his fourth, Margaret Sherger. Died of an epidemic fever.
93. **Susanna Maria Kreiter**. 1, 1. xiii, 7. July 3. Daughter of Peter Kreiter. Aged two years.

94. **Anna Catharina Fertig**, m.n. Seidner. 1, l. xviii, 7. Aug. 23. Born in Wertheim, Germany, Sept. 24, 1723. Her husband, John Christopher Fertig, and she had charge of the Lititz church farm.
95. **Joseph Willey**. 1, r. xi, 8. Sept. 30. Unmarried. Born May 3, 1731, in Okenshaw, Yorkshire, England. United with the Moravians at Fulneck. Master weaver in the Lititz Brethren's House.
96. **Beatus Hanke**. 1, r. xiv, 9. Dec. 8.

97. **John Matthew Kreiter**. 1, r. xii, 9. Jan. 3. Unmarried. Born near Lititz, Dec. 24, 1760. Son (sixth) of Peter and Maria (Hirschy) Kreiter. Consumption.
98. **Regina Kreiter**, m.n. Fertig. 1, l. xvii, 1. Feb. 8. Wife of Andrew Kreiter, fulling-miller. Born Dec. 27, 1755, in Wertheim, Germany.
99. **Anna Ricksecker**, m.n. Meyer. 1, l. xvii, 2. April 24. Born in Ueberschimmerhof, near Worms, March 5, 1720. Her first husband was Henry Schneider, of Donegal; her second, Peter Ricksecker, Sr., of Warwick. Both the latter and she contracted the "camp-fever" in 1778; she recovered but he died of it.
100. **Andrew Horn**. 1, r. xx, 8. Nov. 4. Born March 8, 1717, in Eichenbach, Württemberg. United with the Brethren in Herrnhut, 1742. Came to Pennsylvania 1744, and with his wife, Dorothea Rosina, m.n. Fischer, served the Bethlehem Economy in various ways. Ordained a Deacon of the Church, 1755. Came to Lititz, 1761; was Warden of the congregation, an always useful member of the *Aufseher Collegium*, and, finally, the first and very popular landlord of the Congregation's tavern "*Zum Anker*" (present Lititz Springs Hotel). His remains were the first to lie in the new (present) corpse-house.
101. **Christina Elizabeth Glotz**. 1, l. xii, 2. Nov. 23. Unmarried Sister. Born in Lititz, 1765. Consumption.

102. **Maria Dorothea Lecron**. 1, l. xii, 1. Feb. 9. Unmarried Sister. Born in Cocalico Township, Jan. 14, 1752.

104. **Louisa Danz**. 1, l. xiii, 8. June 21. Aged 3 months.
105. **John William Werner**. 1, r. xix, 8. June 24. Born March 1, 1722, in Manheim, in the Palatinate. Came to this country 1744. His first wife's maiden name was Blum; they had three daughters. Second marriage was to Sr. Schuchard, three sons and two daughters; his third, to Anna Maria Kiesel—three sons and one daughter. By trade a cooper, he was also the village phlebotomist and tooth-drawer.
106. **Jacob August Danz**. 1, r. xiv, 10. July 15. Aged 4 months.
107. **Sarah Van Vleck**. 1, l. xiv, 8. Aug. 11. Infant daughter of Henry Van Vleck.

108. **Catharine Blickensderfer.** 1, l. xiii, 9. Sept. 20. Aged 3 years.
109. **Catharine Glotz, m.n.** Born. 1, l. xvii, 4. Oct. 4. Born in Rhenish Bavaria, March 15, 1733. Wife of Albrecht Glotz. One son and two daughters. Consumption.
110. **Matthew Godfrey Hehl, Episcopus Fratrum.** 1, r. xx, 1. Dec. 4. Born April 30, 1705, at Ebersdorf, Württemberg. Received the degree of Master of Arts in 1723 at the University of Tuebingen. By the influence of Christian David, and, subsequently, that of Zinzendorf, he was led to unite with the Moravians. In 1737 he married Anna Maria Jaehne (see No. 47). Arrived in Bethlehem, 1751. Came in 1756 to Lititz where he was for twenty-eight years the principal pastor and Superintendent of a circuit of Moravian churches in this diocese, of which Lititz was the centre. A profound theologian, an eloquent preacher, a gifted musician and a fine hymnologist, he ranked in usefulness to the Moravian Church with the foremost leaders of his time. The inscription upon his gravestone reads as follows:

130. **Benigna Eichler.** 1, l. xvii, 7. May 17. Born Dec. 28, 1768, in Lititz. Daughter of Albrecht Glotz. Wife of Gottlieb Eichler.
131. **John Daniel Sydrich.** 1, r. xviii, 5. May 22. Presbyter. Born May 1, 1727, in Frankfurt-on-the-Main. His father was Hieronymus Sydrich, a confectioner; mother's maiden name was Abt. After his father's death he went with his mother to Herrnhut—he to live in the Orphanage where he had the ever valued instruction of Bro. Matthew Hehl, its Director, in the languages and sciences. Came to Bethlehem in 1750. Served in the Boys' Schools of Emmaus and Christianspring, going from the latter place occasionally to preach in Shoeneck. Ordained as Deacon, 1760. Married Gertrude Peterson, 1774. Labored in Philadelphia, Hope, N. J., in the Brethren's House in Lititz, and at Graceham, his favorite and last congregation. On May 8, although in very ill-health, he came to Lititz as a member of a synod, at which he was ordained a presbyter, but died soon afterward, May 27. Sr. Sydrich writes of him that "he loved and was loved in return."
132. **Eva Barbara Christ.** 1, l. xvii, 8. June 3. Born in Hempfield Township, Sept. 21, 1746. Daughter of Valentine Grosh. Wife of Daniel Christ. Had five children; Christian, John, Maria Catharine and Susanna. Maria survived her.
133. **Christian David Kreiter.** 1, r. xii, 10. June 5. Unmarried. Born April 5, 1765; a son of Peter Kreiter.
134. **Maria Barbara Geitner.** 1, l. xviii, 8. July 16. Born Jan. 13, 1726, in Hoff, Voigtland. In Bethlehem, 1762, she married the widower John George Geitner and, in 1767, moved with him to Lititz. For her children see No. 138.

Her father was a distinguished surgeon, but an improvident man; consequently, his wife, after his death, finding herself in straitened circumstances, gladly accepted an invitation from her married sister to come to Philadelphia and have a home with her. There the rough behavior of Mary's uncle (Atwood, a merchant, an unprincipled man) caused her much unhappiness; so that, after she had been spiritually awakened by the preaching of Brother Rogers, and told about Bethlehem and its Sisters' House by Valentine Haidt, the artist, she went there, in 1756, and joined that Sisterhood. In 1762 she came to live in the Lititz Sisters' House, and here, secure in God's love and the affection of her "choir" and the congregation, she served on the staff of her *Pflegerin* faithfully to the close of her life as the "*Schreiber*"—writer of the diary, copyist, book-keeper and secretary. She was also the "*Fremden-dienerin*" (visitors' guide), making in that capacity likewise many friends—among them those fine gentlemen Drs. Brown and Allison, who were attached to the U. S. Military Hospital, here, in 1778, and who after their removal corresponded with her. She died of bronchitis.
202. **John Schetter.** I, r. xiii, 11. Aug. 27. Aged 7 months.
203. **Maria Russmeyer,** m.n. Evans. I, l. xvii, 11. Sept. 21. Born Aug. 15, 1721, in Philadelphia; a daughter of Peter and Mary (Moore) Evans, and wife of Rev. Albrecht Russmeyer (No. 169). She had four children, of whom Maria, wife of Christian Schropp, survived her. Died of an epidemic fever.
204. **Anna Christina Meder,** m.n. Weber. I, l. xvi, 1. Sept. 29. She was born 1741, in Wittgenstein, Germany. Her first husband was the Rev. Samuel Angerman, a missionary in Barbadoes, W. I., where he died; her second husband the Rev. John Meder, also a missionary in Barbadoes, but at the time of her death the Principal of the Girls' School in Lititz, (Linden Hall Seminary). By trade a baker, but, as successor to Jasper Payne, he was for a number of years the congregation storekeeper.
208. **Anna Maria Schropp**, m.n. Russmeyer. 1, l. xvi, 2. Dec. 29. She was born in Bethlehem, July 12, 1757. In 1793 she married Christian Schropp, organist and schoolmaster in Lititz, and one son, Christian Russmeyer Schropp, was born to them.

Came to America in 1754, and after living two years in Nazareth, where he assisted in the building of Nazareth Hall, was sent to Lititz, and here he staid for the remainder of his life. In 1768 he married Elizabeth Lack, with whom he had five children: Anna Bernhardina (Harry), Gottlieb, John (who moved to York), Henry Renatus, a sailor, and Christian David, in the neighborhood. He was the master-carpenter who built the Brethren's and Sisters' Houses, the *Gemeinhaus* (present parsonage), the church, and nearly all of the houses in early Lititz; a fact to which he pointed, in his old age, with pardonable pride. For a few years he had charge of the congregation mill.

217. **Niels Tillofson.** 1, r. xvi, 3. April 15. He was born Feb. 4, 1745, in Holstein. After serving as a teacher in the Niesky Boys' School, and as the Superintendent of the Single Brethren in Gracehill, Ireland, he came, in 1791, to this country, and was ordained a Deacon of the Church by Bishop Ettwein. He married Hannah Warner; they had no children. Labored in the Gospel in Shoeneck, Gnadenhuetten on the Mahony, and was the Warden at Nazareth. Served also in Hope, N. J., but there he had the misfortune to fall into the drink habit, which, in addition to his self-imposed incompetency, gave offence to the congregation; therefore he was sent in retirement to Lititz, where, according to his pastor, Bishop Herbst, he did all he could to atone by repentant prayer and ever ready helpfulness for his past shame; and the same authority tells us that he had the love, or good-will, of every one.
218. **Francis Boehler.** 1, r. xvi, 4. June 4. He was born in Frankfort-on-the-Main, Sept., 1722. His parents were John Conrad and Elizabeth Antoinette (Hauf) Boehler. His first wife was Anna Catharine Jag, who died at Oldman's Creek, N. J., 1784. A second marriage was with the widow Anna (Rose) Unger. Two children died in their infancy. He was a retired minister, and died here while on a visit from Bethlehem.
219. **Maria Barbara Tshudy.** 1, l. xv, 7. Sept. 28. A daughter of Matthias Tshudy, aged 5 years.
220. **Catharine Kreiter.** 1, l. xvi, 5. Oct. 19. She was born in Oley, Pa., 1757. Her parents were Frederick and Elizabeth (Frey) Leinbach, and she was the wife of Frederick Peter Kreiter, cooper. Of her five children Samuel, born 1790, Susanna, 1794, and Daniel, 1799, survived her.
221. **Maria Paulick,** m.n. Bauermann. 1, l. xvi, 6. Nov. 5. With her is buried her still-born daughter. She was born in 1784, and was the wife of John George Paulick, blacksmith.
222. **Mary Magdalena Clewell.** 1, l. ix, 3. Dec. 20. Unmarried Sister. Born in Oley, 1745. She was a daughter of Francis Clewell, a farmer, who lived near Nazareth.

231. **Leonhard Schoenlein.** 1, r. xvi, 5. April 3. He was born in Linnelbach, Earldom of Wertheim, April 17, 1746. Married Margaret Fertig. Of their five children, Anna Regina, born in 1775, married Samuel Grosh, merchant, and John (1783) was, like his father, a weaver in Lititz.
232. **Verona Rudy,** m.n. Schnell. 1, l. xvi, 11. April 19. Born in 1722. Wife of Henry Rudy.
233. **Margaret Schoenlein,** m.n. Fertig. 1, l. iv, 1. June 13. Born March 1752, a daughter of John Christopher Fertig, the congregation's farmer. Wife of Leonhard Schoenlein.
234. **Christian Frederick Steinman.** 1, r. xvi, 6. June 17. He was born Nov. 8, 1739, in Epstein, near Manheim, in the Palatinate. Of Menonite parentage, he united, in his sixteenth year, with the Moravians in Ebersdorf. Having come to this country, he was employed at Christianspring on the farm and in the distillery, and after his marriage, in 1785, to Mary Magdalena Peitzel, he served for seven years as the Warden at Gnadenthal. After living for a number of years in Shoeneck, unofficially, but helping that congregation by word and deed, he and his wife came (April 13) to spend the remainder of their lives in Lititz. He was not related to the first Christian Frederick Steinman.
235. **John Grosh.** 1, r. xvi, 7. July 1. A son of John Valentine Grosh, born Feb. 2, 1734, in the Palatinate. His first wife was Barbara Bort, who died in 1781; then he married the widow Margaret Schenck (Fried), and after her death in 1795, the widow Mary Jansen (Fisher). By his first marriage he had six children, of whom Mary Magdalena, born 1765, married, first, Michael Kreiter, shoemaker, in Lititz, and secondly the Rev. John Martin Beck; Elizabeth, wife of John Christ, tinker, in Nazareth; Daniel, in Hempfield Township, and John Jacob, in Waterford on the Susquehanna.

Some of his fellow-voyagers—destined for Lititz—were John Herbst (later, Bishop), John Erdman Oehme, and Gottlieb Eichler, the latter also mentioning in his memoir the above occurrence. In Bethlehem he was again engaged in teaching boys, until, in 1790, he married Anna Johanna Grubé and went with her to his first ministry

in Emmaus, he having been previously ordained a Deacon of the Church by Bishop Huebner. Other pastorates of his were Graceham, Donegal, Bethel, Lancaster (twice) and York. His wife died in 1808. Their children were John, Benigna Louise, and Johanna Elizabeth. In 1812 he married Mary Magdalena Kreiter, m.n. Grosh, and with her served the Lititz congregation as Superintendents of the Married Members, he at the same time practicing medicine, in which he had considerable skill.

At the Golden Anniversary of their wedding he gave a lovefeast, in the church, to the congregation and a dinner to his descendants and nearest friends at the Springs Hotel.

For his calling he was especially gifted; excelling as a teacher, it was a pleasure as well as an advantage to be taught by him, and to experience his influence for good was to many a boy a blessing. Of a cheerful disposition and a winning personality, simple-hearted and guileless, he had yet a remarkable sense of character, so that he could measure a boy almost as soon as he first saw him. Impartially faithful to his pupils, whether they were of high or low estate, bright or dull; scorning the use of sarcastic speech to a defenceless lad; readily giving his kind word of commendation when it was deserved, and bringing to the settlement of difficulties in discipline a superb degree of tact, he won the absolute confidence of his patrons and the lasting love of his boys. The whole number of his pupils during fifty years was 2326.

His activity, however, was not limited to his own educational routine: the public schools of the place and the adjacent country, the Sunday Schools here and elsewhere, claimed his attention always; and, ever appreciative of the beautiful, he planted, at his own expense, a great many of the trees that now yield their grateful shade in our Springs Park.

His long and useful life, through which he never failed to recognize his Heavenly Father's guidance, was perfectly rounded out by the voluntary assistance he gave, until within two weeks of his decease, in his son's private school for boys.

Having completed a classical course at Nisky, he studied in the Theological Seminary of Gnadenfeld, and then was called to America to be a teacher in Nazareth Hall, where he staid until 1830, acting also as one of the professors to three successive classes in the Theological

Seminary. In that year he received an appointment as pastor of the congregation at Emmaus, and was married to Anna Sophia Albright. From 1835 he served the Nazareth congregation for two years, and then filled a like position in Bethlehem until 1850. After a residence of four years on a farm in Middlesex Co., Va., he removed to Nazareth. Here he gave instruction in the classical languages and French in Nazareth Hall, and also lectured on Church History to the theological class then occupying the Whitefield House. In May, 1880, he came to Lititz to live with his son Hermann, Principal at that time of Linden Hall Seminary, and there he departed. He was a man of brilliant, scholarly attainments, and an exceptionally efficient teacher.

969. **General John Augustus Sutter.** Entombed in the north-west corner of the graveyard. He was born in Kandern, Baden, Feb. 15, 1803. Graduated at the military school in Berne, Switzerland. Went to France and joined the army of Charles X. About 1830, he came to America and settled in the western part of Missouri. In 1837 he removed to New Mexico and established himself in Santa Fe; then to California, settling there on the banks of the Sacramento River, and founding a colony named by him New Helvetia. From the Mexican government he received 100,000 acres of land for services rendered, but lost the whole of it through the indifference of Congress toward his claims resulting from the annexation of California. In 1847 gold was discovered on his ranch in that state. In 1871 he came to live in Lititz and from here went often to Washington to urge his just claims, but always to be disappointed. Having paid to the State of California \$30,000 in taxes on the land of which he was bereft, that State granted him a pension of \$3,000 a year; but his ideas of right and wrong were so strict that after ten years, when he had had returned to him the former sum, he refused to accept the latter any longer. He died in Washington, D. C., June 18, 1880, aged seventy-seven years. Although he was not a member of this congregation the Church was proud to give him a resting-place in its burial-ground. Some fifty of his fellow-pioneers came to his funeral, and among them were Generals John C. Fremont and H. T. Gibson, both of whom addressed the multitude of people gathered about the grave. Here he was known as a fine-looking, courtly old gentleman, and, because of his urbane and hospitable ways, was esteemed and respected by the whole community.

Spiritually awakened by intercourse with one of the Brethren, a missionary of the Diaspora, he determined to devote his life to the service of the Church; and, closing his office in Nuremberg, he re-entered the university to study theology. After teaching in the schools of Gnadau and Neuwied, and engaging in pastoral and missionary labors in Basle, he accepted an appointment to enter the newly-organized Home Mission activity of our Church in this country. He was the first Home Missionary in our Province, his initial station being Philadelphia. In 1849 he was sent to Green Bay, Wisconsin, where he founded a flourishing congregation, but in consequence of increasing deafness was obliged to retire from that and other active service in 1863. In 1851 he had married Adeline Maria Greider, of Lititz, and to this place they now retired.

In October, 1885, he returned to America, hoping to spend his last days in Salem, N. C.; but illness was upon him before he reached the South, and he died soon after his arrival in Salem. The Rt.
